Cancer Council Victoria is an independent volunteer-based charity, whose mission is to lead, coordinate, implement and evaluate action to minimise the human cost of cancer for all Victorians.

We conduct and support research, as well as delivering statewide support and prevention programs and advocacy to reduce the physical and emotional burden of cancer. Our leaders are of international standing and we are significantly and positively influencing the cancer agenda in Victoria and beyond.

Cancer Council Volunteers

Volunteers help us to keep administrative expenses down and also raise important funds for and research, education programs and support services for people affected by cancer.

Cancer Council volunteers are from all walks of life. They have diverse backgrounds, interests and skills. One thing common to them all is their desire to put something back into their community.

How can you help?

There are many volunteering opportunities at the Cancer Council:

Office Volunteers

There are many different ways that you can assist the Cancer Council. Around 220 volunteers work in our Melbourne offices on a weekly basis. Our volunteers participate in a wide variety of roles, including:

- Customer service in our retail shops
- Providing administrative support
- Assisting with mail orders
- Answering the phones in the Supporters Hotline
- Packing orders for retail merchandise
- General support tasks in the Volunteer Room (eg. Collating mail-outs)

Telephone Peer Support

Cancer Connect is a telephone peer support service that puts people in touch with others who have had a similar cancer experience. Donations

The Cancer Council is in desperate need of donations of wigs, beanies, and holiday breaks for people who are undergoing cancer treatment. We need more people to sew (not knit) hats, chemo caps and cotton scarves for summer. We also need more donations of holiday homes, units or retreats so we can offer cancer patients a short holiday break. It doesn't need to be long - can be a weekend or two a year.

Training

We will ensure you have the right training to do the job. The type of training will vary depending on the role you are interested in. The majority of our volunteers will receive on-the-job training. However, some roles require volunteers to undertake specialised training specific to the role. All volunteers are invited to attend an orientation program to the Cancer Council.

What's the time commitment?

Your level of involvement is completely up to you. You may want to help out every week or you might want to volunteer on a fortnightly basis. Volunteers generally complete a minimum of a six-hour shift, and a maximum of 16 hours per week. Most Cancer Council Volunteers will undertake a role that requires them to work one day per week.

Everybody has something to contribute, whether it is a one-off event or a regular commitment. Cancer Council Victoria is made up of a strong team that benefits from small and large contributions.

Volunteer Locations

The Cancer Council's head office and retail shop outlet is located in Rathdowne Street, Carlton. The Cancer Council also has a growing number of Volunteer Groups and Can Do Clubs in country Victoria and outer metropolitan areas.

How do you join the team?

To become a volunteer you need to register your interest by completing an application form. Once we receive your application we will contact you to organise a meeting to discuss the volunteer role that would best suit you. Careful consideration is given to matching the right person to the right job.
