

## Enhancing Community Knowledge of Law at the End of Life

# SEEKING INTERVIEWS WITH VICTORIANS

Participation involves taking part in a face to face, telephone or Skype interview (around an hour), at a time and location convenient for you.

### ARE YOU:

- An adult with terminal cancer who is involved in your own medical decision-making?
- An adult family member of an adult with terminal cancer who has witnessed or been involved in medical decision-making?

If you answered **yes** to either of these questions we are seeking your participation in a study aiming to improve understanding of medical decision-making by people with cancer and their family members, including what decision-making practices you use and what support would assist you to make decisions.

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This research has been approved by the QUT University Human Research Ethics Committee, The University of Queensland Behavioural & Social Sciences Ethical Review Committee and the Cancer Council Victoria Human Research Ethics Committee. To minimise any possible distress caused by talking about advanced cancer and end of life, information on how to access counselling services will be offered.
